SAMPLE ITINERARY

Saturday

- Morning: Depart Thessaloniki and head to the port with typically one stop along the way (5 hour drive)
- Noon: Meet your captains, board the sailboats and learn boat rules
- Afternoon: Sail toward Skopelos with a swim stop or two along the way
- Evening: Dock and explore Skopelos town; return to the boat for the night

Sunday

- Morning: Get an early breakfast and depart
- Midday: Sail to Alonissos with at least one swim stop
- Evening: Dock at Patitiri, take bus to the Old Town, sunset views + charming strolls

Monday

- Morning: Sail to Skiathos, with swim stops along the way
- Evening: Explore the most cosmopolitan island -shopping, nightlife & outdoor cinema

- Morning: Pack up & return by boat to the mainland
- Afternoon: Meet our driver and return to Thessaloniki

WHAT TO EXPECT

Join us on a 4-day, 3-night sailing adventure through Greece's most iconic island group—the Sporades! Travel by sailboat to the breathtaking islands of Skopelos, Alonissos, and Skiathos, home to turquoise waters, charmin g old towns, and Mamma Mia movie magic.

Spend you day at sea and your nights docked at each island's port. And maybe even see a dolphin or two!

Each island is different: Alonissos is peaceful and artsy, Skiathos is busy and cosmopolitan while Skopelos is a mix of the two. Every student has a different favorite island!





What to pack

Pack everything in a small backpack - no hard side luggage here!

Light, breathable clothing

a light jacket or hoodie for cooler evenings

Swimsuits (you'll live in them)

Reef-safe sunscreen

A towel (quick-dry preferred)

Dramamine or motion-sickness meds

Power bank (outlets are limited)

Water bottle

Small backpack or tote for island exploring

Cash (some shops don't take cards)

Waterproof camera or waterproof phone case Swim shoes - you;'ll want to swim to shore to

explore the rocky coast

What you should know

Water = Liquid Gold

- Shower's are limited. Use water wisely—this isn't a hotel!
- Quick rinses only. Skip the long showers-opt for a salt water swim instead!

Boat Plumbing Is Fragile

- Absolutely nothing but organic waste in the toilet. No baby wipes, no toilet paper, not even single-use contact lenses!
- Anything else goes in the bin next to the toilet. Yes, even that.

- Sleeping Quarters Are CozyCabins are tight; think "tiny home on water."Most beds are shared between classmates. Bring a sense of humor and some deodorant.

Pack Your Boat Snacks

- Before departure, each boat will receive a small budget for lunch and snack essentials.
- Think: wraps, cold cuts, protein bars, fruit, water, iced coffee, etc.
- Lunch is usually on the boat, so shop smart

- Trust your captain—they know what they're doing.
